


Policy Review

- 32 local authorities
- Local transport strategies & active travel plans
- Digital searches



Local Policy

- ALL documents
 - #school > #child
 - Include bike training (road safety)
 - Targets for increasing proportion of children cycling and walking to (primary) school




Local Policy

MOST documents mention

- School travel plans
- School streets

SOME documents mention


- Safe routes to school
- Ibike (high school)
- Cycle Friendly Schools
- Play on Pedals and/or other promotional projects



Local Policy

• FEW documents mention

- Preschool, primary AND high school age groups (Glasgow City an exception)
- Non-school travel
- Access to bikes
- Family cycling (e.g. cargobikes)



Aberdeen City

'develop a network of safe and attractive cycle routes across the city centre, through the provision of low speed, low flow streets and segregated infrastructure, so that an unaccompanied 12 year old child can safely cycle through the city centre.' SUMP, 2017



Aberdeen City

To ensure all young people have the opportunity to travel to school by active and/or sustainable modes of transport and are equipped with the necessary knowledge, skills and infrastructure to allow them to undertake local journeys safely and independently. ATAP, 2021
